- Amount to cover 100% Tuition and applicable Fees
(at a public institution or comparable amount at a nonpublic institution)
- \$300 each fall and spring semester for textbooks and college-related expenses
- Summer 2018 - 100% Tuition and applicable Fees
- Academic Top Scholars – additional stipend of \$44 per credit hour (Fall and Spring)

Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS)

- Amount to cover 75% Tuition and applicable Fees
(at a public institution or comparable amount at a nonpublic institution)
- Summer 2019 - 75% Tuition and applicable Fees

First Generation Matching Grant

- Funding changes from a 1:1 to a 2:1 match
- 2019-20 Appropriation: \$10.6 million

Benacquisto Scholarship

- Extends eligibility to National Merit Scholars who are non-Florida residents
- Award will be equal to that of an in-state student
- Out-of-state recipients are exempt from paying out-of-state fees

Florida Farmworker Student Scholarship

- Provides total of 50 scholarships annually
- Scholarships cover tuition and applicable fees at a Florida public postsecondary institution
- Recipient must enroll full-time and maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA
- SSFAD Program Code: FFSS

State Reporting

- December 1 – Deadline for both the Loan Volume Report and the Student Financial Aid Report (SFAR)
- Specifies that the data for SFAR is to be reported at the student level

State Calendar

- Institution Renewal Application – closes June 6
- Grade & Hours (Spring) – closes June 30
- Reconciliation (Fall/Spring) – request funds June 1
- Reconciliation (Summer) – request funds June 21
- Summer DER – closes August 9
- Grade & Hours (Summer) – closes September 30

DER File Layout

Highlights for 2019-20

- File length remains the same
- FRAG = Effective Access to Student Education Grant
- FFSS = Florida Farmworker Student Scholarship

Disbursement Eligibility Report (DER)

- OSFA encourages institutions to put students on the DER prior to actually funding the student to ensure the students are allowed to be funded
- Other checks made on the DER include:
 - Student owes for prior year dropped/withdrawn hours
 - Student did not meet renewal requirements
 - Student has no remaining hours or terms
 - Student disbursement greater than allowable
 - Student previously awarded baccalaureate degree

Deadlines

Bright Futures

- Report Students on DER – 30 days after the end of regular registration each semester
- Undisbursed funds – return funds 60 days after the end of the regular registration
- Drop/Withdrawn Hours – return funds 30 days after the end of the semester

Deadlines (Cont.)

Effective Access to Student Education (EASE) Grant

- Report Students on DER
 - Term 1: October 30
 - Term 2: February 28
- Undisbursed funds – return funds 60 days after the end of the regular registration

Deadlines (Cont.)

Access to Better Learning and Education Grant (ABLE)

Undisbursed funds – return funds 60 days after the end of the regular registration

Deadlines (Cont.)

Schools failing to meet the statutory deadlines for returning funds may be provided program funds on a reimbursement basis the following term or subsequent academic year.

Payment Summary Screen

- Review voucher amounts by program and term
- Review if your institution owes OSFA, or if OSFA owes your institution for current and prior years
- Check the “I agree” box to request additional funds
- Attach the completed Refund Transmittal form with your refund check

FSAG Process for 2019-20

- Base amount = 90% of 2019-20 disbursements.
- Remaining appropriation distributed based on all eligible students reported by all institutions.
- Each semester term allocation will represent 50% of the total annual allocation.
- Per administrative rule, refunds are due to the department within sixty (60) days of the end of the institution's regular registration period.
- Report all 'otherwise eligible' (C99) students to OSFA by April 1 in order to be considered for supplemental funds.
- Reconcile and return any undisbursed funds by June 1.

Effective Access to Student Education

Eligible Students:

- U.S. Citizen
- Florida Resident
- Attend an eligible institution full-time (12 credit hours)
- Enroll as an undergraduate student, in the process of attaining a first bachelor's or baccalaureate degree
 - Associate of Arts
 - Bachelor's of Arts
 - Bachelor's of Science

Bright Futures Summer Funding

All eligible Florida Academic Scholars (FAS) and Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS) may be funded summer 2019.

Students who are FAS/FMS Eligible for 2018-19 (Term 6)

- Native Students
- Transfer Students

Students who are FAS/FMS Eligible for 2019-20 (Term 0)

- Initial Students – 2019 high school graduates

Bright Futures Summer Funding

Summer Deadlines:

- Summer sessions with May or early to mid-June drop/add dates – Reconcile by June 22.
- Summer sessions with late June or July drop/add dates – Reconcile by August 1.
- Summer Term 6 DER closes August 10
- An institution that receives funds from the program for the summer term shall remit to the department any undisbursed advances within 30 days after the end of the summer term.
