I am sure we can all think of a million different examples but today we will address three - students, staff and other departments.








#### A crucial conversation has three ingredients:

Satisfactory Academic Progress

Professional Judgments

Inability to pay

Parent refusal to provide information

Why am I not Pell Eligible?

Why does FA keep students from staying in school?







- Maintain a dialogue with the student/parent
  - Allow them to express frustrations
  - Let them feel heard
  - Actively listen to what is being said
- State what you agree with
  - Allows the conversation to start on a positive note
- State the facts
  - Do not make it personal







Explain why they failed SAP

Explain this is a Federal requirement

Ask if they have any questions

Use plain language

Offer solutions
